Re: Intervention on Maycock Appeal Case No. 18-80 Via: Email and Certified Mail

Dear Mr. Ableson, Mr. Chris Dugovich, and Mr. Colin Maycock,

On behalf of Local 114, I write to request that Local 114 be permitted to intervene and participate in Mr. Colin Maycock's pending appeal before the Full Judicial Panel.

Like Mr. Maycock, Local 114 submitted a request for information from Council 2 for the disclosure of certain financial information. As you know, the issue as to whether Council 2 must disclose the requested information to Mr. Maycock is now pending before the Full Judicial Panel.

There is direct overlap between what Mr. Maycock requested and what Local 114 requested. Particularly, Local 114 requested disclosure of "The gross wages paid in 2017 – broken down by position name" as well as other germane data pertaining to managerial compensation. See enclosed letter of December 21, 2018 to Mr. Dugovich.

On January 8, 2019, at a meeting of Local 114, Pat Thompson – the Council 2 staff representative assigned Local 114 -- explicitly rejected Local 114's request for this information based upon grounds identical to the grounds which the Hearings Officer rejected Mr. Maycock's request. Local 114 is of the opinion that both these determinations were in error and that Local 114 has a right to review the information that both Local 114 and Mr. Maycock had requested.

It would be duplicative and inefficient for Local 114 to undertake an identical but separate review of the refusal of its request since the resolution of Mr. Maycock's appeal will similarly articulate the rights of Local 114 has as to what information it is entitled to receive.

Accordingly, Local 114 respectfully requests that it be allowed to submit briefing and otherwise participate in the proceedings before the Judicial Panel.
